Prior to the meeting commencing, local resident Mr N Land was invited to speak regarding planning application PA/2016/1490. Mr Land stated he endorsed the objections put forward by the Barton Civic Society regarding the outline planning proposals. He felt that the town centre itself needed issues addressing and prioritising, citing Louth as an example of a market town that had managed in the main to keep out major development and to retain some of its' unique status.

126. **Planning Matters**

(a) Planning Applications

It was proposed by the Chairman and agreed by Members present to bring forward agenda item 3(a)(5)/2 as follows:

(i) <u>PA/2016/1490 – North Lincolnshire Council (Estates Department)</u> for Outline Planning Permission to erect retail supermarket, public house and up to 70 dwellings off Ferriby Road, Barton.

The Chairman, Councillor Mr J Oxley read out two letters of objection received by the town council regarding planning application PA/2016/1490 and then invited all members present for their comments. These included the recent planning permission granted for a supermarket and garage development at the other end of Ferriby Road together with congestion of traffic on Ferriby Road at peak periods. Planning legislation issues - both local and national were outlined and discussed. Concerns regarding the infrastructure of the town and viability of the town centre core strategy. Out of town developments and the adverse affect on town centres. The primary schools in the town were deemed to be currently full to capacity. The suggestion of a family type public house/restaurant was welcomed as the town currently does not have this type of venue, therefore deemed it would be an asset to the town. Concern regarding further development of the town, it was felt to be nice as it is and required careful management. The outline planning application needed to be treated with caution at this stage, until full details could be viewed at the public consultation to be held on 6 October, so more information could be sought. The Local Development Framework was discussed and the opportunities for employment and housing needs to be right for the town. The recreational use of the land and the woodland was debated. The gateways to towns and cities and the effect on local tourism this has. Possible opportunity for a new school in the town. The access and egress outlined in the plan was deemed to be unsafe and required looking into for safety concerns together with traffic noise levels. Access onto the A15 and the Humber Bridge and the historical embankment "buffer zone" of the site.

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Concern was raised regarding the existing drainage problems of the location site and flooding issues of drain off. Development of the town required to be vibrant to enable local residents to shop and use facilities in the town. It was noted that four town centre public houses had already closed in recent years. Proposals for 3-storey flats on the development site would raise concern for overlooking issues. Protection of the town centre was deemed as paramount and that the current location of the Lidl Store required management together with the rights of the car parking arrangements there.

The Chairman, Councillor Mr J Oxley, seconded by Councillor Mrs J Mason, requested that a Recorded Vote to be taken by the Planning Committee Members present regarding the planning application. Councillors Mrs A Clark, F Coulsey, Mrs J Mason and Mr J Oxley voted unanimously to object to the principle of the outline planning application to North Lincolnshire Council.

Resolved that the comments as stated, be made to North Lincolnshire Council on the following Planning Applications:

(1) <u>PA/2016/1490 – North Lincolnshire Council (Estates Department)</u> – Outline Planning Permission to erect retail supermarket, public house and up to 70 dwellings at off Ferriby Road, Barton (Objection: the town council are against the principle of the application for outline planning permission);
